LETTER TO ED VAIZEY

The following is a copy of a letter sent by the PPG to Mr Ed Vaizey, the local MP:

Dear Mr Vaizey,

I am writing on behalf of the 'patient participation groups' of Wantage surgeries.

Firstly, thank you for your work and support.

It is with pleasure that at long last we see hope of funding (rent increase) for a new extension has been agreed and we await the detail. 10,500 new extra patients have been allowed for in the next ten years.

Meetings with you and the OCCG to finalise the details are due in April / May. If we can help in any way with information or a representative from us to attend any of these meetings - please let me know.

We note each of our FTE GPs has 2,206 patients on their list, the highest in the South West area.

The patients are concerned about the proven increase in demand impacting on the ability to reach current standards in spite of the staff working hard.

1. It is taking longer to be answered on the telephone
2. Less available appointments
3. Waiting times to see your own GP are increasing
4. The number of new patients registering is taking up a good deal of resource

The surgery staff need all the help and support we can give.

SPECIAL DAYS

You have probably noticed that different health conditions have special days, weeks or months when attention is paid to that condition by charities, groups etc. so I thought it would be interesting to include a few of these in issues of the Newsletter.

May 1-31: National Walking Month – encourages people to walk more throughout May. *We all know how important walking is for those who are able to walk, the cheapest exercise there is!*

PRESCRIPTIONS REQUESTS

Please be reminded that prescription requests need to be made in writing. This can either be done by registering for on-line access or by e-mailing churchstreet.prescriptions@nhs.net. You should allow 48 hours for prescription requests to be processed and 72 hours for your medication to be ready for collection from your nominated chemist.

PATIENT ADVISERS – APPOINTMENTS

Our GPs have asked our trained Patient Advisers to continue to ask you initial questions, including the reason for requesting an appointment, to ensure that you are signposted to the most appropriate appointment at the most appropriate time; the appointment will either be in person or by telephone. The consultation you are offered may be with a GP, Nurse Practitioner, Emergency Care Practitioner or another member of the nursing team. You may also be offered an appointment at another surgery as the practice is part of a neighbourhood of practices (Didcot, Faringdon and Wantage) aiming to increase the amount of appointments available to patients.
